

Other associated costs that are difficult to quantify



- Management's time to supervise
- Human Resources/Payroll administration which is usually a cost borne by other departments within a larger organization
- Vehicle down time due to on-road break downs, auto accidents and scheduled maintenance
- Liability exposure of having vehicles on the road/ risk of large claims
- Liability exposure of workers comp claims
- Driver replacement when driver is off work
- Driver training time
- Increase in facility insurance cost to cover drivers on the road
- Compliance with City, State and Federal drivers laws

Fixed cost VS Variable cost: An employee driver is still costing as much when not need them.

Volume of delivery work is frequently not the same at all times. Sometimes you need 3 drivers and other times only 1 or 2.
